



Matt Donner and the Boys and Girls Club Pilot Program

During the months June-August, Matt Donner had the fortunate opportunity to teach ceramics and sculpting at the Boys and Girls Club of Georgetown. Matt Donner, president of TSOS, collaborated with Chuck Collins, executive director of GTX Connects, Cam Huff, president of Georgetown Art Works, and Kelly St Julien, branch director of the Georgetown Boys and Girls Club to create a grant endorsed, pilot program, teaching sculpture and ceramics to middle and high school aged students. The program became a success. Working from creative ideas to physical works of art was more than rewarding for all involved. We were able to reach many children who had never worked their hands in clay. TSOS is thankful for the opportunity and hopes that the program takes off for future Boys and Girls Club members.

Gregory Beck at Los Colinas

The first phase of the Ferro di Prua Sculpture installation is now complete. These stainless steel sculptures have been securely mounted to their Corten steel bases and concrete footers along the Las Colinas canal, adjacent to the Gondola dock. The next steps include the application of a rust patina to the bases and the installation of eight indigo-colored LED floodlights on each sculpture. Adding to the visual appeal, the grey tile walls behind the sculptures will feature a waterfall cascading from the pool above.

The Kiva East Santa Fe Trail Screening Fence in Dallas, TX, is now complete and installed. My design features five translucent graphic panels, created by printing on gauze encapsulated between polycarbonate sheets, and five laser-cut steel panels representing the sun's journey through the day. The entire design is framed in custom steel and illuminated by LED lights at night.

The fence stands 6.5 feet tall and stretches 50 feet in length, offering both functional and aesthetic value to the trail and parking lot. Special thanks to Levi with London
